21st Century Learning Skills: The Big6 Information Research Process

Description: Collaborative planning between teachers and media and technology professionals offers many opportunities to design and implement authentic learning activities for students that promote higher-order thinking skills as part of 21st Century literacy. This workshop will focus on the importance of an information research process as part of 21st century learning. Strategies and resources for implementing each of the stages of the Big6 will be shared. Hands-on activities are included. Participants will work in teams and should come prepared with a unit topic or curriculum objectives as a focus for the planning activities in the workshop.

Level: K-12; all curriculum areas

Who: Collaborative teams of one media specialist and one teacher
